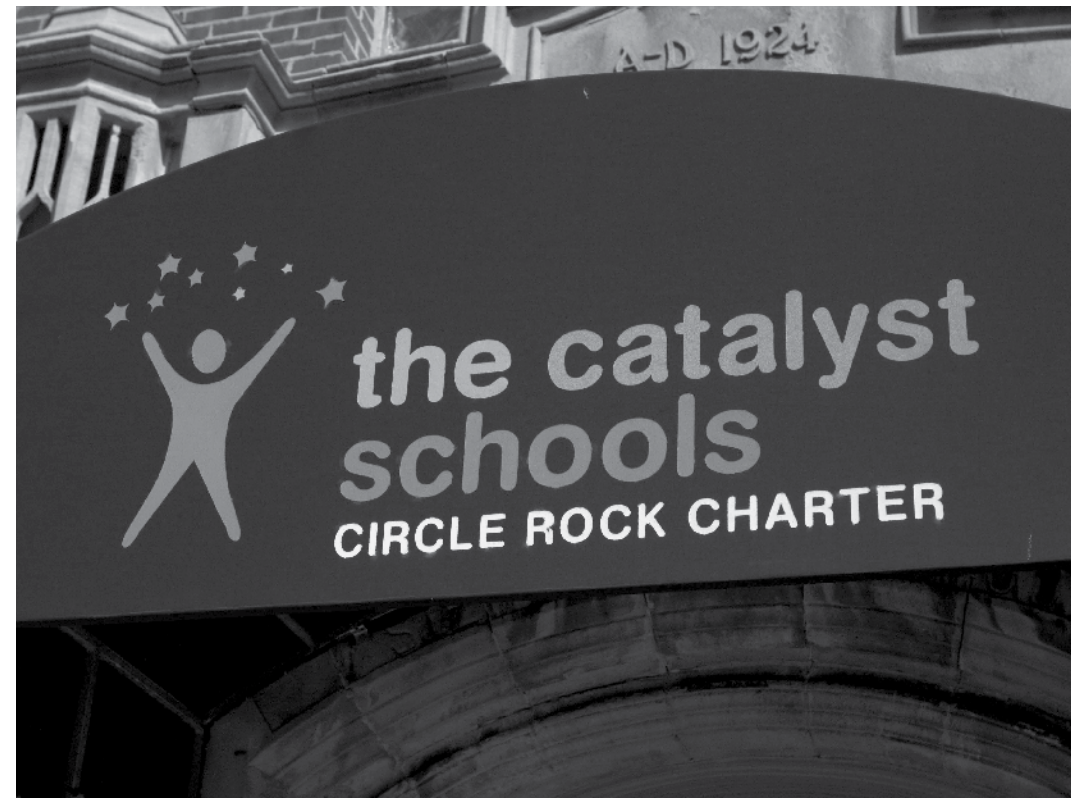

FROM THE DESK OF GORDON HANNON



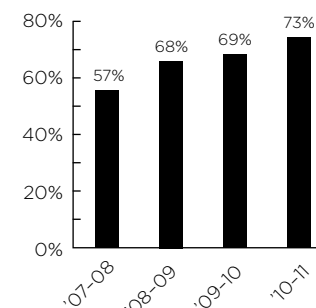
Catalyst had a year to remember. Both campuses went through a rigorous charter renewal process by Chicago Public Schools and received full renewal without condition — the only charters in Chicago to do so. Our enrollment jumped from 722 to 1,030 scholars. At Circle Rock, 84% of scholars who have been with us more than one year met or exceeded expectations in reading and math combined, while scholars new to Howland advanced 10% above their incoming scores. Our 228 graduates are in some of Chicago's finest high schools, keeping pace for a 100% on time high school graduation. In fact, 98% are in a high school with a track record of college placement. In addition, 18% of our graduates are in Selective Enrollment Schools. Our partners continue to help our scholars shine: Ravinia awarded us a full student orchestra, our scholars performed with the Lyric opera and Chicago Children's Choir, Communities in Schools Chicago provides abundant resources for scholars and families, and Circle Urban Ministries attends to mentoring and spiritual support. At each campus, in every room, there are champions working every day to produce results above the ordinary. Thank you for being a member of the Catalyst community and for your continued support.

HERE WE GROW AGAIN

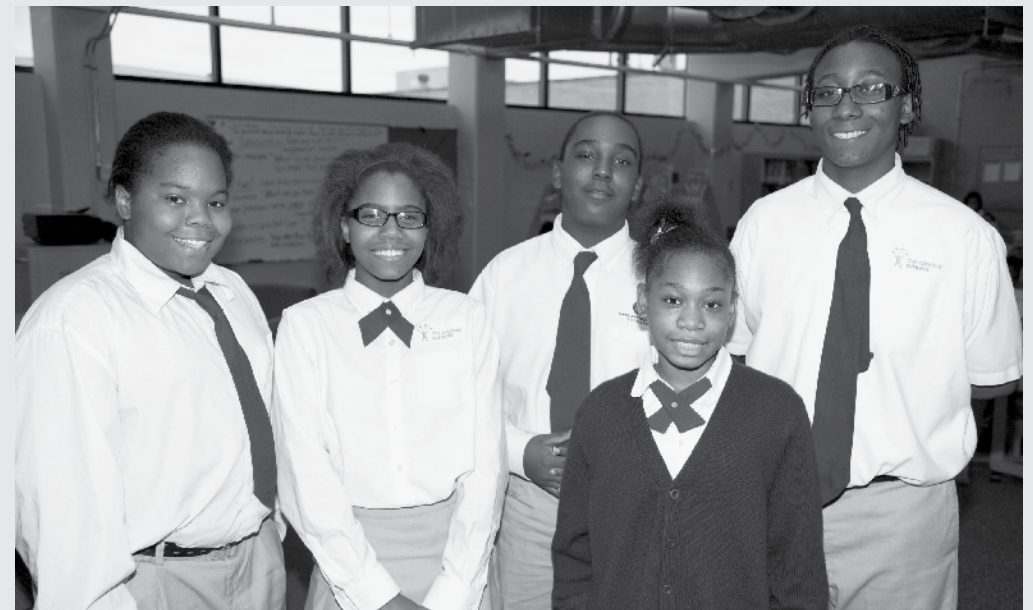
The Catalyst Board of Directors has established a list of goals for the Catalyst Schools — and the growth of our network is on that list.



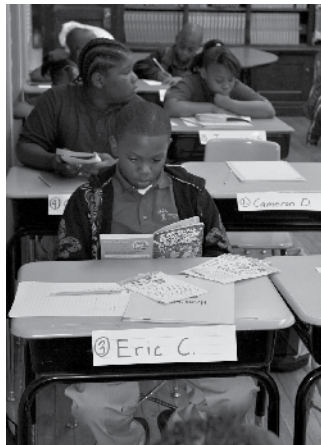
